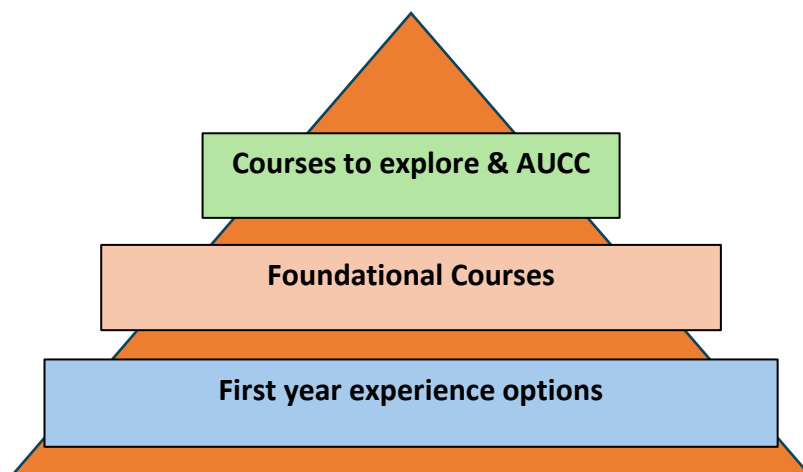


EXTC: Education & Teaching

FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCE options – choose one:
